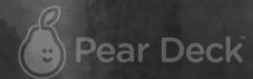

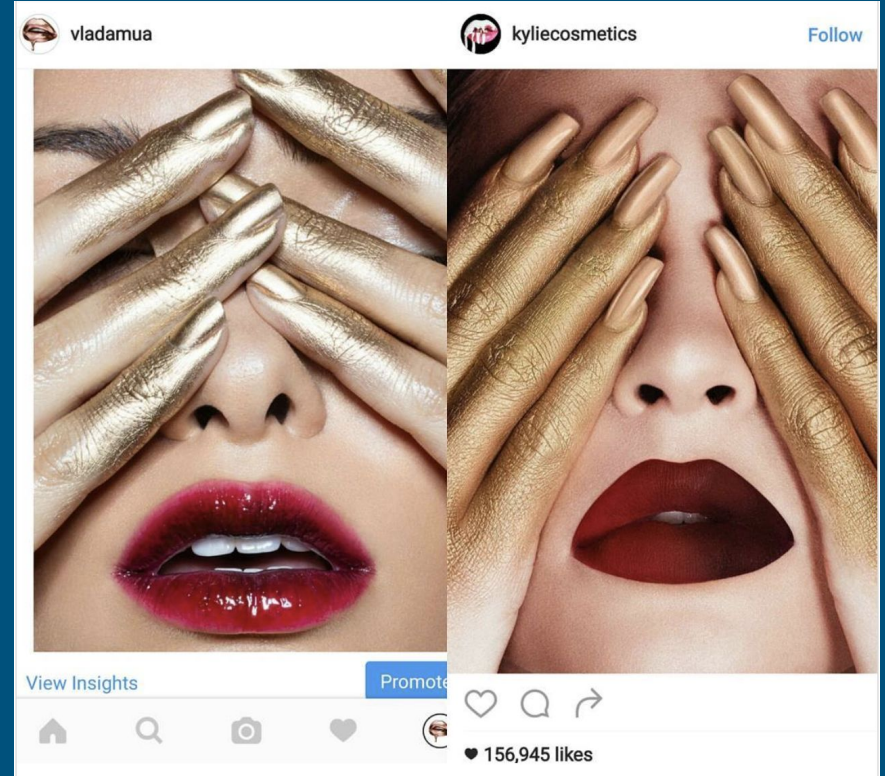

---

- ❖ Use the first word or title listed in the MLA citation.
- ❖ Use page numbers when it's a print source.

Type of Plagiarism: Mashup (Mix copied sources)

# The Labor of Laziness

---

The writer takes the time to paraphrase most of the paper from other sources and make it all fit together, instead of spending the same effort on original work.

Example:

Original:

Marie Curie, née Maria Skłodowska, was born in Warsaw on November 7, 1867, the daughter of a secondary-school teacher. She received a general education in local schools and some scientific training from her father.

Rewrite:

Born in Warsaw on November 7, 1867, Marie Curie was a member of a humble family who helped her to develop her basic education, including scientific training. She is the only person who has ever won Nobel Prizes in both physics and chemistry.

# The Forgotten Footnote

---

The writer mentions an author's name for a source, but neglects to include specific information on the location of the material referenced. This often masks other forms of plagiarism by obscuring source locations.

## Example:

### Original:

Marie Curie, née Maria Sklodowska, was born in Warsaw on November 7, 1867, the daughter of a secondary-school teacher. She received a general education in local schools and some scientific training from her father.

### Rewrite:

According to the Nobel Prize Foundation, Marie Curie, was born in Warsaw on November 7, 1867.

# The Misinformer

---

The writer provides inaccurate information regarding the sources, making it impossible to find them.

## Example:

### Original:

Marie Curie, née Maria Skłodowska, was born in Warsaw on November 7, 1867, the daughter of a secondary-school teacher. She received a general education in local schools and some scientific training from her father.

### Rewrite:

Smith says, Marie Curie, was born in Warsaw on November 7, 1867, the daughter of a secondary-school teacher. She received a general education in local schools ([Smith](#)).

# The Too-Perfect Paraphrase

---

The writer properly cites a source, but neglects to put in quotation marks text that has been copied word-for-word, or close to it. Although attributing the basic ideas to the source, the writer is falsely claiming original presentation and interpretation of the information.

## Example:

### Original:

Marie Curie, née Maria Skłodowska, was born in Warsaw on November 7, 1867, the daughter of a secondary-school teacher. She received a general education in local schools and some scientific training from her father.

### Rewrite:

Marie Curie, was born in Warsaw on November 7, 1867, the daughter of a secondary-school teacher. She received a general education in local schools and some scientific training from her father ([Marie Curie - Biographical](#)).

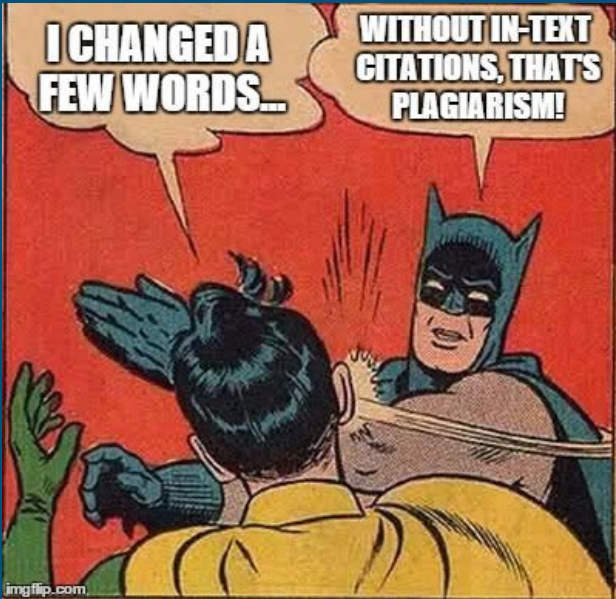
