What is plagiarism?

"unauthorized use or close imitation of the language and thoughts of another and the representation of them as one's own original work, as by not crediting the author."

In other words: Stealing the author's information without giving credit

Plagiarism or NOT Plagiarism Original Passage

Sea turtles are found in all warm and temperate waters throughout the world and migrate hundreds of miles between nesting and feeding grounds. Most sea turtles undergo long migrations, some as far as 1400 miles, between their feeding grounds and the beaches where they nest.

Plagiarism or NOT?

A sea turtle's habitat encompases all the oceans of the world with warm waters as they travel great distances to find food and mates (Defenders).

Plagiarism or NOT Plagiarism

Original Passage

When females come to the shore they dig out a nest in the ground with their back flippers, bury their clutch of eggs and return to the ocean.

Plagiarism or NOT?

Female sea turtles return to the ocean after coming to shore to dig out a nest in the ground with their back flippers to bury their clutch of eggs.

Write everything in your own words

Paraphrase - small
Summarize - large

Always CITE, CITE, CITE!

give credit to your authors/sources
Make a citation

Citation - how you give credit to a source, usually in a specific format

READ, Paraphrase, SHARE

Sea turtles spend most of their lives in the water, where not much information can be gathered on their behavior. Most of what is known about sea turtle behavior is obtained by observing hatchlings and females that leave the water to lay eggs. Sea turtles, like salmon, will return to the same nesting grounds at which they were born. When females come to the shore they dig out a nest in the ground with their back flippers, bury their clutch of eggs and return to the ocean. After hatching, the young may take as long as a week to dig themselves out of the nest. They emerge at night, move toward the ocean and remain there, solitary, until it is time to mate.
